
Zoning:

Summer Tax Collection:

The Summer tax bill is due by September 14, 2021. Beginning September 15th interest is added at the rate of 1% per month or fraction of a month before being turned over to the County Treasurer as delinquent on March 1, 2022. Payment can be mailed to the Reading Township Treasurer at P.O. Box 298, Reading, MI 49274. Please separate and return the top 1/3 of the green copy with your payment. Due to Covid restrictions, mail-in payments are encouraged. Receipts will be mailed to you.

You may use the secure drop box or pay in person at the township hall (with Covid restrictions) on the dates of:

Saturday, September 11, 2021 from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, September 14, 2021 from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

NOTE: If a mortgage company should pay your tax bill, it is your responsibility to forward the bill to them. Please note the information included with your taxes regarding deferment of the tax due date.

New Drop Box: Have you used our new black drop box at the township hall? It was helpful during the general election when many residents used the absentee ballot system due to Covid restrictions. We will continue to use the small drop box for tax payments.

Road Improvements for 2021:

The following road projects will be completed in 2021:

Road Stabilization Twp. Share \$7,344.00 Spring Limestone Patch (1000) Twp. Share \$15,000.00 and completion of Crawford/Long Lk. To Wildwood Berm, Ditch & Gravel (0.82 mile) Twp. Share \$4,960.00.

Total: \$27,304.00

The Hillsdale County Road Commission Manager and Board have informed the Reading Township Board that there will be no other township projects planned for this year, as they will be concentrating on County Primary Roads. If you have special road concerns, please contact a Reading Township board member asap.

Repair continues to be coordinated on Ridge Drive. It is hopeful that this project will be completed soon.
